Winchcombeshire Millenary Band of Bellringers

"Some of you may be aware that this year marks the 1000th anniversary of the West Midland Shire system which created Gloucestershire and the surrounding counties. Less well known is that it also created Winchcombeshire, which existed for just 10 years before being swallowed up by (mainly) Gloucestershire. Like other counties, the 139 parishes of Winchcombeshire were divided into 12 Hundreds.

To ensure that this anniversary of the founding of Winchcombeshire should not pass unnoticed, the current band in Winchcombe plan to start the celebrations with a peal on Monday 7th May. We are encouraging all the parishes in the former Winchcombeshire that have ringable bells, to support us by ringing either a peal or a quarter peal some time during the year after this date. To mark this occasion we will be creating the Winchcombeshire Millenary Band of Bellringers, membership of which will be conferred on all who ring in a Winchcombeshire celebratory peal or quarter. As a memento we will be making available a Winchcombeshire Millenary certificate for all those who participate.

Within the next few weeks all the above parishes will be receiving a letter to this effect to encourage them to ring with us.
