Men (and Woman) Paint Wall! (St Mark's)

With a lot of effort from Anna Bayley, Simon Ridley and Colin Bookless the churchwarden, the walls at St Mark's are finally painted and the project begun in 2004 is finished. The tatty old walls and dust covered coats are a thing of the past.

Nothing is worse than a tatty ringing room. Even with a good ring of bells, a dirty and unloved room can not only make ringing a grim experience for seasoned ringers but it is hardly likely to make new ringers and visitors want to stay.

If you are wanting to attract new ringers and welcome your visitors, perhaps your ringing room could do with sprucing up? If so, read on....

So what makes for a better ringing room? From a brief trawl of the facebook ringing sites the following seem to feature as a must have:

- Clean and free from dust
- Not cluttered with old furniture and junk to catch a rope on (and not be the flower arrangers' cupboard or junk store)
- Have clear lines of sight
- Cleanly decorated in light colors and have a good floor covering
- A supply of large boxes (large in area not height), a marlin spike or 'fid', ample hooks for coats and comfy properly designed seats (not wobbly worm-eaten pews saved at the last reordering)
- Good lighting which is not at eye level nor creates shadows
- Good ventilation and heat as required
- Storage for the vacuum cleaner, spare ropes and bits and bobs
- Some information about the bells. A bit of local history and information is also popular.

Does your ringing chamber match these ideals? If not and you would like to do something about it, get in touch with one of the branch officers. We are happy to cast an impartial eye over things and perhaps help with (or find someone to help with) the work.

Of course, if you plan to decorate there are some rules to follow...

Most, if not all our churches are old - they usually date from before cavity walls and damp proof courses. This means the stonework is designed to absorb and then 'breath' moisture. The paints to use allow for this breathing and do not form a sealed surface – meaning that moisture doesn't get trapped in the wall causing the stonework to crumble, and in winter your paint won't start flaking off. So don't just run down to B&Q and get a tin of Dulux!

Do the PCC need to know?

Many of our buildings are listed. This means there is a legal obligation to use correct materials when painting. Failure to do so could land your PCC and church wardens in hot water. Besides, painting or creating a new space may be a good opportunity to foster better relations with your PCC and demonstrate why the work is necessary.
