11. Election of Independent Examiners

The Management Committee recommends the re-election of Charles Woodd and Michelle Harris.

12. Subscriptions for 2012 - The Management Committee recommends that they remain unchanged as follows:

Seniors: £10 of which £7 goes to BRF, £1.50 to General Fund and £1.50 to the Branch

Retired Members: £5 of which £4 goes to BRF, 50p to General Fund and 50p to the Branch

Juniors: £2.50 of which £1.50 goes to BRF, 50p to General Fund and 50p to the Branch.

The subscriptions were raised to these amounts from 1/11/2007.

13. Affiliation Fee 2012

The Management Committee recommends that it remains unchanged at £10 - last raised from 1/1/1994.

14. Replacement for the Best Kept Tower Competition

At the 2010 AGM the **Best Kept Tower** Competition was suspended pending ideas for a replacement. Several suggestions were put forward and these were considered by the Branch Officers at their meeting on 5 March this year. Their view was that the very important aim of improving and supporting good bell maintenance would be better met by other means, and the means they recommended are now in the process of being implemented. But as regards a competition, they recommended that a **Tower of the Year** Competition be initiated.

The essential feature of the Competition would be that each year each Branch would nominate one tower on whatever grounds they thought appropriate. That nomination might be for maintenance undertaken, or it might be for high quality training of learners, or it might be for inspired recruitment, or it might be for the help given to others. Indeed, it might be for anything. The Branch would give a short report in support of their recommendation, and the winner would be decided by a secret ballot of all present at the annual Branch Officers' Meeting. The details of the winner and the runners-up would be circulated so that other towers could then make use of their good ideas.

The Management Committee fully accepted the Branch Officers' recommendation, and on their behalf the Secretary will therefore propose that a *Tower of the Year* Competition be instituted for 2012 with the first awards being presented at the 2013 AGM. If the motion is successful, he will circulate draft rules to all Branches for discussion.

The Management Committee recommends that the Gloucester Branch's kind invitation to host the AGM on Saturday 21 April be accepted.
